FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY February 2025



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE Its DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

It is hard to believe that it has been Five years since we started doing internments/burials at the Fargo National Cemetery. This month's newsletter figures are from 13 October 2019 through 28 February 2025.

There are 267 urns in the Columbarium, 590 urns in the ground, 30 caskets in the private vaults, 258 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,147 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. THIS INCLUDES 918 VETERANS AND 229 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,147. THERE ARE 136 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

THE breakdown per branch of service is as follows: Army—470, Navy – 188, US Marine Corps—68, US Air Force -180, ARMY/AF—4, and Spouses—229, for a total of 1,147 internments/burials.

For the month of February 2025, the Fargo Memorial Honor Guard had 9 Internment and 130 volunteer hours. Our yearly volunteer hours are 2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 2022 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,557, 2024 = 2,889, and 2025 = 411. From 13 October 2019 through 28 February, we have accumulated 15,378 donated volunteer hours

THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA - LOCAL CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

Enrollment & Eligibility: Available Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM.





Post 21 Gaming Manager Position

After 19 years, Dennis Beckerleg is stepping down from his role as Gaming Manager for Post 21. Consequently, Post 21 is seeking someone to fill this position. Interested candidates must be active members with voting rights at the Moorhead American Legion, Post 21. Gaming in Minnesota is heavily regulated by the state Gambling Control Board, and Managers must adhere to all their regulations. Ensuring that Post 21 and its Gaming employees comply with these regulations is the most crucial responsibility of the Gaming Manager.

The MN Gambling Control Board provides a two-day Gambling Manager Seminar in Roseville, MN. During this seminar, new managers learn about their duties, regulations, and compliance requirements. Attendance is mandatory, and a test is administered afterward.

The position is considered part-time. We believe this individual will inherit a highly trained staff, with many having worked at Post 21 for 15-20 years or more.
