FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY January 2025



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE Its DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

It is hard to believe that it has been Five years since we started doing internments/burials at the Fargo National Cemetery. The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019 thru 31 DECEMBER 2024.

There are 265 urns in the Columbarium, 585 urns in the ground, 27 caskets in the private vaults, 246 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,125 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. THIS INCLUDES 899 VETERANS AND 226 POUSES FOR A TOTAL OF 1,125. THERE ARE 136 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

The breakdown per branch of service is as follows: Army—461, Navy - 183, US Marine Corps—69, US Air Force - 182, ARMY/AF—4, and Spouses—226, for a total of 1,125 internments/burials.

For the month of December, the Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has 7 Internment/Burials for 10 volunteer hours. Our yearly volunteer hours are 2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 2022 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,557, and 2024 = 2,899. From 13 October 2019 to 31 December 2024, we have accumulated 14,827 donated volunteer hours.

WE HAVE ADDED THREE NEW MEMBERS TO THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD. WELCOME TO LARRY ASMAS, BRADTEBERGANDALLENLIEDBERG. CONGRATULATIONS!! WE STILL HAVE ROOM FOR MORE NEW MEMBERS.

THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERAN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA, LOCAL CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard will NEVER cancel a Veteran's internment because of bad weather. The family has to make that decision.



Shooting Sports

It is now time to talk about our archery youth support. The High School Archery Leagues started when school began in September. As I said earlier, the sport is limited to a Genisis Bow, which fits shooters of any size. That way, every shooter in their class will use the same equipment regardless of size or strength. All shooters are equal, with no equipment advantage. The target used is the Olympic-style bullseye target.

Teachers and Coaches must go through the required training. They must be a Certified NASP-BAI instructor. That requires a one-day training session conducted by qualified advanced instructors. The topics covered are range safety, shooting form, equipment maintenance, and competition rules. The curriculum of this shooting sport is entitled 'ON TARGET FOR LIFE.' It covers archery history, safety techniques, equipment, mental concentration, and self-improvement. With this curriculum, teachers have reported the following. Students are enthusiastic to learn about archery. Student's behavior and attendance are improved on the archery days.

Students who traditionally resisted PE classes are now eager to participate. I spoke to parents and Grandparents who said their children who have taken archery classes have done better in their school work.




