

Please remember if you have not paid for your dues for 2026, we are still accepting them. We need to get our numbers up there! Let me know if anybody has any questions.



What Is a Giving Hearts Charity — and Why It Matters to Veterans

Every year, our community comes together on Giving Hearts Day to support charities that make a real difference in people's lives. Giving Hearts Day is a special time when individuals, families, and businesses donate to causes close to their hearts — helping neighbors, nonprofits, and local programs continue their important work. One of the most important local veteran charities is the Cass/Clay Veterans Gap Fund. This fund was created by Cass and Clay Counties as a last-resort emergency fund for veterans facing extreme hardship the Gap Fund helps veterans who are:

- Homeless or about to lose housing
- Facing eviction
- In crisis situations with no other resources
- Experiencing severe financial hardship

While federal and state programs exist, many veterans fall into "gaps" because of residency rules, timing issues, or paperwork delays. The Gap Fund fills those gaps when no other help is available. Veterans Service Officers from Cass and Clay Counties carefully review each request and work with the Fargo-Moorhead Area Foundation to provide short-term assistance such as motel stays, gift cards, and emergency support while veterans work toward long-term solutions

This assistance is once-in-a-lifetime, making every donation even more meaningful. 





As promised, I will now write about our archery sports. As promised, I was going to write about MN State archery program (NSAP). I am going to write, about this great program, just not in the way I had planned to do.

The MN National Archery School Program, part of NASP, offers co-ed archery instruction for grades 4-12 as part of physical education. The program introduces students to all aspects of archery, including equipment, shooting techniques, and safety rules, with a strong emphasis on safety.

Nationwide, more than 200,000 youth participate in this archery program. In the previous year, hundreds of young participants competed at state-level events, while thousands took part in the National Shoot. This program tends to be particularly effective in smaller schools, likely due to the reduced number of participants, which facilitates smoother administration and operation.

As I mentioned at the beginning, I wasn't able to write this section as I had intended. An unexpected situation came up, and unfortunately, my attempt didn't go well. I had previously been told that Mhd High was using this program, but when I visited MHD HIGH, I found out they were not.

I haven't reached the MN State NASP director yet. I'll provide an update when I have more details.

IRA - Individual Retirement Account QCD - Qualified Charitable Contribution

If you have an IRA and are 70½ or older, you can make a transfer from your IRA directly to a qualified charity using a QCD, and it will be tax-free. These transfers are a great way to give to a qualified charity, especially if you do not itemize deductions or file a tax return.

The amount is not reported as income and is not taken as an itemized deduction if you file a tax return. The amounts must be paid directly from your IRA to the qualified charity.

Our American Legion is a qualified charity. If you want to use this method to donate to our American Legion, contact the trustee of your IRA to arrange a direct payment to "American Legion Post 21".

Your holder (trustee) of your IRA or your tax preparer should be able to answer any other questions you have concerning a QCD.
