President's Corner

Spring Greetings!

Last night, I returned from volunteering with the Honor Flight of ND/MN. It is always an honor to bring our heroes on a trip of a lifetime to see their memorials and listen as they relate to each other about their military experiences. It is a very emotional time for all. Each Veteran gets a surprise mail call with many letters from family and friends. This is a highlight of the trip. Several of our Auxiliary members are also very active as volunteers, assisting with fundraising and on flights. Some of our members also help with the preflights. Our Auxiliary donates money to our local Honor Flight, and we are proud to contribute to all these events that honor our heroes.

May is poppy month. With the donations we receive from poppies, we can help Veterans and their families and use the money to help with the Honor Flight.

After World War I, the Poppy flourished in Europe. Scientists attributed the growth to soils in France becoming enriched with lime from the rubble left by the war. From the dirt and mud grew a beautiful red poppy, which came to symbolize the blood shed during battle following the publication of the wartime poem, In Flanders Fields. The poem was written by Canadian Lt. Col. John McCrae while serving on the front lines. On September 27, 1920, the poppy became the official flower of the American Legion Family to memorialize the soldiers who fought and died during the war. Led by the American Legion Auxiliary, each year, members of the American Legion Auxiliary distribute poppies with a request that the person receiving the flower make a donation to support the future of Veterans, active-duty military, and their families.

Please, when you see our Auxiliary members with poppies at events at Post 21, know that your donation will help our Veterans in many ways.

Our next meeting will be on May 5th at 6:00 pm. There is another Honor Flight that weekend, so several of us will be gone, but our members will hold the meeting as usual.

As we always remember our Veterans, let's especially remember them this month of May as we honor them by wearing a red poppy.

Here is a little history on Memorial Day. Originally called Decoration Day, from the early tradition of decorating graves with flowers, wreaths, and flags, Memorial Day is a day for remembrance of those who have died in service to our country. It was first widely observed on May 30, 1868, to commemorate the sacrifices of Civil War soldiers, by proclamation of Gen. John A. Logan of the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of former Union sailors and soldiers.

During that first national commemoration, former Union Gen. and sitting Ohio Congressman James Garfield made a speech at Arlington National Cemetery, after which 5,000 participants helped to decorate the graves of the more than 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers who were buried there.

This national event galvanized efforts to honor and remember fallen soldiers that began with local observances at burial grounds in several towns throughout the United States following the end of the Civil War, such as the May 1, 1865 gathering in Charleston, South Carolina organized by freed slaves to pay tribute and give proper burial to Union troops.

FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD

FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY

May 2025



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE ITS DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

It is hard to believe that it has been five years since we started internments/burials at the Fargo National Cemetery. The figures for this month's newsletter cover the period from 13 October 2019 to 31 March 2025.

There are 272 urns in the Columbarium, 593 urns in the ground, 29 caskets in the private vaults, 268 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,164 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY. This INCLUDES 927 VETERANS AND 237 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,164. THERE ARE 135 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY

THE breakdown per branch of service is as follows: Army—477, Navy—192, US Marine Corps—64, US Air Force—194, ARMY/Air Force—4, and Spouses—237, for a total of 1,164 internments/burials.

During the month of March, the Fargo Memorial Honor Guard conducted 9 Internments/Burials, which accounted for 180 volunteer hours. Our yearly volunteer hours are 2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 2022 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,557, 2024 = 2,889, and 2025 = 621. From 13 October 2019 to 31 March 2025, we have accumulated 15,558 donated volunteer hours.

On 4 April 2025, Larry Hovland, a member of the Fargo Memorial Honor Guard, passed away. He would drive from Pelican Rapids, Minnesota, to help us out. Sometimes, the weather wasn't the greatest, but he would still make the long drive to Fargo. His comment would always be, "It is an Honor to do this for our Veterans." We will miss him!

There have been a number of Veteran internments and burials in the area, including local churches and community cemeteries.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed the Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard will NEVER cancel an Internment of a Veteran because of bad weather. The family has to make that decision.

Veterans Service Officer

Happy May,

April allowed me to travel to Washington, DC, to attend the National Association of Counties Veteran Service Officers leadership summit, which opened my eyes to how veterans continue to fight at home. These advocates watch Senate and House bills that could help and hinder our lives. Some key takeaways are below, and as always, please consider contacting your specific leadership. Your voice does matter, and we want to be treated fairly and with respect for what we have earned. Transparency matters, and as allows, please email Curt and me with any questions.

Hamilton Vets Lost Record Act - This is a bill introduced in the 118th Congress aimed at assisting veterans whose service or medical records were lost or destroyed. It would allow the Department of Veterans Affairs to use alternative evidence to determine eligibility for benefits. The bill has been referred to the Committee on Veterans Affairs in both the House and Senate. (S3452)

Hyperbarics – through community care and seeking VA use for veterans with diabetes, GI issues, and mental health.

VA Sec Collins, “Community care is back.” (\$300 million into community care since he started). “Reduction in force is coming”. I'm not sure what cuts are coming or where now. Stay tuned.

Sharks/Bad character – Guard Act (yes) and PLUS Act – “please let us steal” – making money off your benefits. This is accreditation vs fees – we want all veterans to file claims with accredited representation, as that process is free. This is about consumer protection and getting you, the veteran, all the benefits you earned.

Burial Non-Service-Connected vs Service Connected– items on the rise and inflation – cost disparity lessening. Possibly working towards more benefit when a hero passes.

Improve access to residential treatment and more options for care in rural areas.

12,000 claims a day are being decided by the Veteran Benefit Administration, and the average claim time at the regional office is over 90 days.

Hoping for the best and all those Veterans attending the latest Honor flight, thank you.

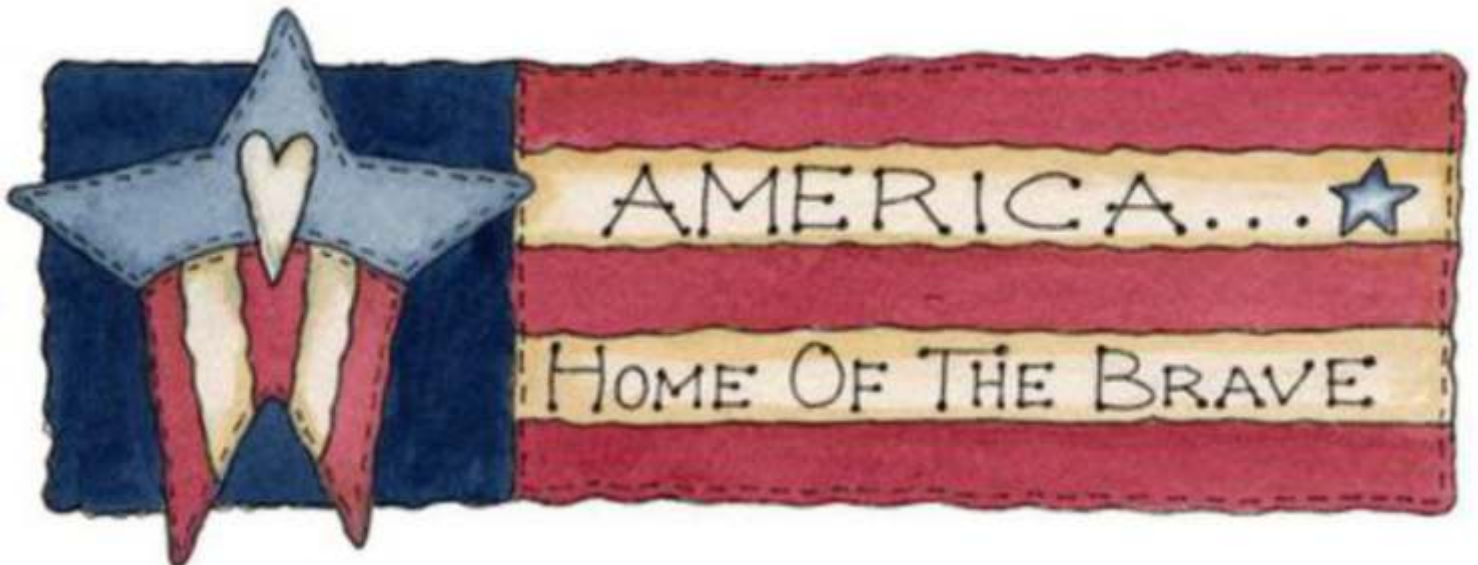

Shooting Sports

This month let's revisit Archery. The NASP (National Archery School Program) teaches focus, self-control, discipline, patience, and life lessons essential for success in school and life. Similar to the MN State Clay Target League, NASP aims to improve students' academic performance. Parents, grandparents, and others have noticed these positive changes. Both programs are among the safest high school sports with no serious accidents. Additionally, both shooting sports are co-ed and accessible to handicapped individuals.

NASP has significantly expanded since 2002. By 2004, 1.3 million students in 9577 schools participated, with 1638 tournaments held and 104,650 Basic Archery Instructors trained. NASP offers a \$1000 grant to schools starting a program. By 2024, NASP awarded \$4 million in scholarships to participants.

The NASP (National Archery in the Schools Program) is generally implemented as part of Physical Education classes. Our Post supports archery through Lake Agassiz Bowman. Historically, we contributed to their Archery Education program. Presently, our support includes providing 3-D targets for co-ed youth and cub shooters.

After 19 years, Dennis Beckerleg is stepping down from his role as Gaming Manager for Post 21. Consequently, Post 21 is seeking someone to fill this position. Interested candidates must be active members with voting rights at the Moorhead American Legion, Post 21. Gaming in Minnesota is heavily regulated by the state Gambling Control Board, and Managers must adhere to all their regulations. Ensuring that Post 21 and its Gaming employees comply with these regulations is the most crucial responsibility of the Gaming Manager.

The MN Gambling Control Board provides a two-day Gambling Manager Seminar in Roseville, MN. During this seminar, new managers learn about their duties, regulations, and compliance requirements. Attendance is mandatory, and a test is administered afterward.

The position is considered part-time. We believe this individual will inherit a highly trained staff, with many having worked at Post 21 for 15-20 years or more.
