

UNIT 21 AUXILIARY MEMBERSHIP





FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD FARGO VA NATIONAL CEMETERY



THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD HAS BEEN SERVING THE FARGO VETERANS NATIONAL CEMETERY SINCE Its DEDICATION ON 7 SEPTEMBER 2019.

It is hard to believe that it has been Five years since we started doing internments/burials at the Fargo National Cemetery. The figures for this month's newsletter are from 13 October 2019 thru 30 September 2024.

There are 253 urns in the Columbarium, 558 urns in the ground, 27 caskets in the private vaults, 234 caskets in the Government vaults, and 2 plaques on the Memorial Wall, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,074 INTERNMENTS/BURIALS AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETERY.

WHAT DID ONE ELEVATOR SAY TO THE OTHER ELEVATOR?

THIS INCLUDES 853 VETERANS AND 221 SPOUSES, FOR A TOTAL OF 1,074. THERE ARE 124 COUPLES INTERRED/BURIED AT THE FARGO NATIONAL CEMETARY.

THE breakdown per branch of service is as follows: Army—440, Navy – 176, US Marine Corps—66, US Air Force -173, ARMYAF—4, and Spouses—221, for a total of 1,074 internments/burials.

During the month of September, the Fargo Memorial Honor Guard conducted 23 Internment/Burials for 321 volunteer hours. Our yearly volunteer hours are 2019 = 966, 2020 = 2,072, 2021 = 3,373, 2022 = 2,798, 2023 = 2,557, and 2024 = 2,614. Since 13 October 2019 through 30 September 2024, we have accumulated 13,828 donated volunteer hours.

WE HAVE ADDED THREE NEW MEMBERS TO THE FARGO MEMORIAL HONOR GUARD. WELCOME TO - LARRY ASMAS, BRAD TEBERG AND ALLEN LIEDBERG. CONGRATULATIONS!! WE STILL HAVE ROOM FOR MORE NEW MEMBERS.

THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF VETERN INTERNMENTS/BURIALS IN THE AREA - LOCAL CHURCHES AND COMMUNITY CEMETERIES.

The Fargo Memorial Honor Guard has performed Military Honors in all types of weather. The FM Honor Guard WILL NEVER cancel a Veteran's internment because of bad weather. The family has to make that decision.

This is a busy few months and please look for local events in observance of "Veterans Day". On Veterans Day, we honor the service and sacrifice of all Veterans – living and deceased. Please check the Cass or Clay County Facebook page in the coming weeks for more information. Thank you for your service and your continued support.



a couple of weeks ago, I had the opportunity to attend a VFW conference. I wanted to share some main points that could possibly help you in the future.

- 1. VFW had 580,000 claims filed last year 2024
- 2. \$14 billion in benefits paid out to veterans and families 2024
- 3. FY 2024 -44% of appeals were canceled, withdrawn, no-show, or postponed. VFW's message was to be

accountable and present for your veterans

- 4. TERA veterans are to be automatically added to the burn pit registry the link is to opt out
 - -https://vethome.va.gov/burnpitregistryoptout/
- 5. Myhealthevet to be sunset in 2025 veterans to use one system for logging in to their accounts possibly va.gov
- 5. Incarcerated veterans can be reduced from 10% to ½.
- 6. VALife Insurance is available https://www.va.gov/life-insurance/
- 7. Memorial Urns are available for veterans if the family chooses to go that route only option and no plot/columbarium marked
- 8. https://operationhomefront.org/ has housing assistance for those in crisis https://operationhomefront.org/housing/
- 9. ChampVA is always the second payer for insurance (6-9 months backlog on applications)
- 10. Caregiver Support Program 70% SC for veterans to qualify -
- 11. Over 2 million claims were nationally processed last year
- 12. Base called K2 warning order pending base in Uzbekistan that US took over pollutants and chemicals warning order pending
- 13. Drop in childcare pending up to 3 hours for reimbursement for MH appointments Childcare initiative

Please be aware of the claim "sharks". Curt and I work for you, the veteran and we are FREE. North Dakota will be seeking legislative session to protect you from these "sharks". - ii. Protect ND Veterans and dependents from Claim Sharks, Fraud and Abuse.
- iii. Mirror 118th Congress bills: HR 1139 and S 740 on the GUARD Act. Governing Unaccredited Representatives Defrauding VA Benefits Act.
- iv. 22 States are prohibiting or limiting attorney fees for advising and assisting Veterans in filing VA claims.
- v. New Jersey-Prohibiting all compensation.
- vi. Prohibiting non-attorney advisers etc. from charging fees
- vii. Limiting attorney fees as per federal regulations
- viii. Provide penalties, fines, and criminal charges.
- ix. Passing of the PACT act removed penalties from 38 Code of Federal Regulations creating issues for VA to enforce regulations.
- x. No fiscal note expected.

Redesigned Airborne Hazards and Open Burn Pit Registry

On August 1, 2024, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) launched the redesigned Airborne Hazards and Open Burn Pit Registry (the Burn Pit Registry).

The registry is an important research tool that enables VA to identify and study health challenges spanning the Veteran and service member population as a whole – providing Veterans and service members of this generation an opportunity to help improve the care and benefits of Veterans and service members in generations to come. Ultimately, the registry is a database that combines Veteran and service member data to help VA better understand, research, and ultimately improve treatment and benefit options for the health challenges experienced by Veterans and service members exposed to airborne hazards and burn pits during their military service.

Importantly, participation in the registry is optional and does not impact nor determine eligibility for VA health care or benefits.

If you meet the eligibility criteria listed below, there is no action required by you – you will be included. However, if you do not wish to be included in the registry, you can opt out anytime by submitting an "opt out inquiry" at https://vethome.va.gov/BurnPitRegistryOptOut/ Important updates to the registry include:

- The automatic inclusion of 4.7 million Veterans and service members who, according to U.S.
- Department of Defense (DOD) records, meet the participation criteria outlined below.
- The removal of a cumbersome 144-question registry questionnaire.
- Establishment of an easy registry opt-out process.
- Veterans and service members (living or deceased) who, per DOD records, served in the military

Veterans Service Officer - Continued

- campaigns or theater of operations listed below from August 2, 1990, through August 31, 2021, will be automatically included:
- Operations and Campaigns: Desert Shield and Desert Storm (ODS/S); Iraqi Freedom (OIF); Enduring Freedom (OEF); and New Dawn (OND)
- Bahrain, Iraq, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Somalia, United Arab Emirates, Gulf of Aden, Gulf of Oman, and waters of the Persian Gulf, Arabian Sea, and Red Sea
- The Southwest Asia theater of military operations and Egypt
- Afghanistan, Djibouti, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Uzbekistan, or Yemen any time after September 11, 2001
- Associated airspaces of the countries and bodies of water listed above
- Please note that if you've already begun enrollment in the Burn Pit Registry, thank you for the steps you've taken, and no further action is required. You will have already been enrolled in the redesigned registry if you are eligible.
- Veterans can check their status by contacting their local Environmental Health Coordinator. Active-duty service members can check their status at https://vethome.va.gov/inquiry
- We look forward to sharing the Burn Pit Registry's future research findings and the better future made possible by the nearly 4.7 million Veterans and service members participating. Thank you for your service and for helping VA provide better care to all Veterans.

This fall season for the MN. State High School Clay Target League has now ended, as I said last month. The kids now use what they learned this summer to join family hunting trips and enjoy the friends and family camaraderie. The kids are now thinking of the spring shooting season.

I am now talking to the VOLUNTEER Head Coaches to learn about their teams this year. This month, I spoke to coach Brent Brinkman from the DGF shooting team; Brent said they had 33 CO-ED shooters who competed this fall. They did well and had a ball. Of those 33 shooters, 20 went on to shoot in the MN State Shoot in Alexandria, MN. That shoot takes over 12 weeks to complete. The reason is that over 10,000 kids from throughout the state compete yearly. This, again, is for individual and team honors. This is a big deal for the kids. Like the shoots at the Glyndon Rod and Gun, SAFETY is the top priority.

Of those 20 State shooters, 5 went on to shoot at the National shoot in Michigan, and They again represented DGF and GRG very well. We should be very proud of these area youth.

Coach Brinkman also said that all the volunteer coaches' work is worth it to see the smiles. The smiles come from the Kids when they get their first 20 or 25 hits out of 25 shots. It's also the smiles of the parents, grandparents, and family members. A few shooters got their perfect 25-patch this year. Brent was very happy to see the team's camaraderie.
